<p>Early Learning Council</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In collaboration with other community leaders hosted a countywide community visioning conversation led by the Coastal Community Foundation on April 17, 2018 (G3, O1). • Hosted an event for the Early Childcare Collaborative Childcare Providers to provide information about the Palmetto Shared Services Alliance and accepted applications for scholarships (G2, O1). • Chose PSSA scholarship recipients and planned an awards event for them (G2, O1).
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NYSAN Quality Self-Assessment Study Group discussed the assessments of Element 3 and explored Element 4 (G1, O1). • GCSD Data Analyst presented his first Summer Slide Collaborative Impact Report (G1, O2). • Training Committee assessed the training needs of members and is planning a training event on “Trauma Informed Care” for May 24 (G3, O1). • Advocacy Committee discussed a plan for gathering information about why some children and youth do not attend out of school time programs (G4, O2).
<p>Health Care Collaborative for Children & Youth (HCCCY)</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Data sharing report showed that HCCCY members had received 248 new referrals for their services since January 2018. This response demonstrated an improved process for collecting data (G1, O1). • Plans to update the HCCCY brochure for the next meeting and plans to submit a blog for the website (G2, O2). • Heard a report on the Georgetown County community-wide roll out of Triple P (G3, O1). • Heard a presentation about trauma-focused and child-centered yoga (G4, O3).
<p>Southern Georgetown Leadership Group</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approved the 2018 Strategic Plan. • Continued to plan a health fair that could be held in conjunction with back to school night at Sampit Elementary School (G3, O1). • Heard a report from Dwight McInvaill about the progress on the Southern Georgetown County Library project (G2, O1). • Began planning the annual “Meet and Greet” for October 2018 (G1, O4).

<p>Early Childcare Collaborative (ECC)</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Members attended an event to learn about the Palmetto Shared Services Alliance (PSSA). • Several early childcare providers signed up to become members of the ECC. • Early childcare providers applied to receive funding for membership in the PSSA. The Frances P. Bunnelle Foundation and the Institute for Child Success provided this funding. • The ECC Planning Team began planning a celebration to award scholarships to 11 ECC members.
<p>Cross Collaborative of Service Coordinators</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heard a presentation from the Continuum of Care Program (G2, O1). • Discussed the 2018 findings from their data-sharing network and concluded that their question about literacy had captured a more accurate picture of the literacy needs of adults in Georgetown County. Also discussed the data on domestic violence and dental care (G1, O3). • Decided to spend the next meeting getting a clearer idea of the services CCSC members provide (G2, O1).
<p>Youth Community Connections -YC²</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completed Strategic Plan for 2018. • Heard reports from each collaborative representative. • Made a decision that each collaborative would bring performance measures and/or program indicators for review to the next YC² meeting. • Made a decision to develop a preliminary survey form for all collaborative groups to submit their data for the group to review.
<p>Triple P Planning Team</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Met with representatives of Children's Trust to hear about their plans to support the Georgetown County communitywide rollout of Triple P. If they receive funding from the Duke Endowment (which they feel fairly certain they will get), they plan to provide the following for Georgetown County: (1) a Triple P Program Executive Director, (2) a Triple P implementation coach, (3) training and materials for the duration of the 3-year grant, (4) support from the Frank Porter Graham Impact Center to help with implementation and evaluation, and (5) implementation of Level 1- "Staying Positive," which is a marketing tool that provides positive parenting messaging for the community.
