## Youth Collaborative Update- July 2017

- **Community Connections Formed**

Representatives of the 8 Bunnelle-supported youth-focused collaborative groups joined forces with representatives of the Black River United Way (BRUW) collaborative groups to form a consolidated group called "Community Connections." The purpose of this group is to share resources, network, and problem solve.

- **Community Wide Roll Out of Triple P**

The Early Childhood Physician's Advisory Council (ECPAC), the Health Care Collaborative for Children and Youth (HCCCY), and the Early Learning Council (ELC) have formed a planning team to implement a community wide implementation of Triple P (an evidence-based parent education program). This community-wide implementation would train 60 practitioners to deliver services to 7,500 families.

- **Three Data-Sharing Partnerships Begin**

Members 3 Bunnelle-supported collaborative groups- the Summer Slide Collaborative, the Health Care Collaborative for Children and Youth (HCCCY), and the Cross Collaborative of Service Coordinators – have implemented data sharing processes that will inform and improve their practices. In addition these data-sharing partnerships will help to show the collective results of their work.

- **Film Literacy Youth Project (FLYP) shows over 200 Georgetown Children and Youth Films at the Strand Cinema**

Members of the Georgetown County Out of School Time (GCOST) Collaborative formed a partnership with the Strand Cinema to offer film literacy to children and youth who attend out of school time programs during the school year and during the summer. Participating programs agree to use literacy-based lesson plans pre and post film to promote analytical thinking and other literacy skills.
